



Acclimatisation in Ladakh

Ladakh lies at an elevation over 3,000m/11,500ft above sea level. To prevent Acute Mountain Sickness (AMS) we have built in first days of acclimatization in relatively lower Leh before going to higher altitudes in the southeast. Please consult your medical advisor before embarking on this tour.

Safety in Kashmir and Ladakh

Large volumes of domestic tourists visit Kashmir and Ladakh incident-free each year and foreign visitors are treated as honoured guests. The last incident involving foreigners was in 1995. Separatist leaders in Kashmir have regularly stated that they welcome tourists. Their issue is with the Indian government not tourists. A heavy military presence lends to a safer travel environment. Nevertheless, we keep a close watch on developments. In the unlikely event of trouble in either region, we will reroute to Punjab. See Registration Form for more detail.
